Na ca lo piom cennē tuany ē COVID-19 kɔc juēc arēētīc dōm thīn wennē cī yīn yōōk wu ba yānkuōōn yīn keek cɛth thīn ya tekic amāāth, ke yīn lēu bī yīn ya miōōc nē wēu ye keek dōm kɔc nē thɛr cennē tuany ē COVID-19 piny riōōk nhom, tē cīn kee kākē kɔn looi:

- Tē rēer yīn, tē luui yīn wennē tē cīn lo paan de* Commonwealth cī caal ke ye paan cennē tuany ē COVID-19 rɔt thiāi piny arēētīc thīn, cennē lōŋ cennē cāth kuum thīn tāāu
- Tē ēluui yīn wēnthɛr tēduōōn ēyennē yīn dōm thīn, ku cī tuany ē COVID-19 rɔt thiāi piny ēpiomduōōn kēnnē wennē cī yīn kuōm rēer paan tōŋduōōn kēnnē yīc, ke yīn cī bī ya lo tē de luōōi nē ye kōōl kēnnē wennē tē cennē nīn kee 8 cennēke cāth kuum thook thōk
- Tē cīn nhom ciēn wēukuōōn ye keek bɛr yōk nē kōōlduōōn de 8 cennēke cāth kuum wennē tē cennē ye kōōlduōōn kēnnē thok thōk, ku ca dōŋ ke yī cīn nhom ajuīɛr bennē yīn bɛr ya miōōc nē wēu

Biāk de bēi ke Sydney

Kōōl de 8 cennē kɔc thiōōk nhīim nē yōōtken yīc nē bēi ke Sydney aci rɔt jōōk nē bɛi nīn 1, pɛi de Dhorou nē ruōōn de 2021 yīc. Yīn lēu bī yīn ya miōōc nē wēu ye keek dōm kɔc nē thɛr cennē tuany ē COVID-19 piny riōōk nhom nē door yīc kee 5, nē yom Kamith nē pɛi nīn tōk agut cī Yom Jimma nē pɛi nīn 30, nē pɛi de Dhorou nē 2021.

Yīn lēu ba ya thiōōŋ nē kuōny de wēu nē kaam de:

- Pɛi nīn 1, Pɛi de Dhorou ke ajuīɛr de kaam de pɛi nīn 1 agut cī pɛi nīn 7, Pɛi de Dhorou, 2021
- Pɛi nīn 8, Pɛi de Dhorou ke ajuīɛr de kaam de pɛi nīn 8 agut cī pɛi nīn 14, Pɛi de Dhorou, 2021 abī rɔt looi
- Pɛi nīn 15, Pɛi de Dhorou ke ajuīɛr de kaam de pɛi nīn 15 agut cī pɛi nīn 21 Pɛi de Dhorou, 2021 abī rɔt looi

Piömdīit de Sydney (Greater Sydney)

Kööl de 8 cennē kōc thiöök nhīim nē yōötken yiic nē bēi ke Piömdīit de Sydney aci rot jōok nē bæi nīn 1, pæi de Dhorou nē ruöön de 2021 yic. Yin lēu bī yin ya miöc nē wēu ye keek döm kōc nē theēr cennē tuany ē COVID-19 piny riöök nhom nē door yiic keerou, nē Yom Lääät nē pæi nīn njan agut cī Yom Jimma nē pæi nīn 16, nē pæi de Dhorou nē 2021.

Yin lēu ba ya thiöŋ nē kuöny de wēu nē kaam de:

- Pæi nīn 4, Pæi de Dhorou ke ajuier de kaam de pæi nīn 4 agut cī pæi nīn 10, Pæi de Dhorou, 2021 abī rot looi
- Pæi nīn 11, Pæi de Dhorou ke ajuier de kaam de pæi nīn 11 agut cī pæi nīn 17, Pæi de Dhorou, 2021 abī rot looi
- Pæi nīn 18 Pæi de Dhorou, nē ruöön de 2021 yic, ke ajuier de kaam de pæi nīn 18 agut cī pæi nīn 24 Pæi de Dhorou, nē ruöön de 2021 yic
- Pæi nīn 25 Pæi de Dhorou, nē ruöön de 2021 yic, ke ajuier de kaam de pæi nīn 25 agut cī pæi nīn 30 Pæi de Dhorou nē ruöön de 2021.

Ękuöny de wēu kënnē abī ya yiēn kōc rēēr, luuikē, wennē cīkkē lo nem nē Greater Sydney, the Blue Mountains, the Central Coast, Shellharbour wennē Wollongong.

Yin bī ya thiöŋ nē athöör wāaciic ago yin jal ya miöc nē kee wēu ke kuöny kākē nē door yiic kee 3 ke ye theēr wään cennēke cāth kuum thīn wennē piömdīit de Sydney.

Na bī yin ya miöc nē kee wēu ke door de diäk kënnē, ku yin bukku ya thiēc men lēu bīn wēuku ya cuat piny ke yī kēn ku thiēc nē theēr kōk bī bēn yiic ke aköldēt. Na ca yekännē gam, ke yin bī ya miöc ē wēu nē theēr kedhie cennēke miöc de wēu liēp thok kōc.

Na noŋ kē kōr ba thiēc nē tēn cennē kāŋ gēer thīn, ēka kōr ba döc ya cōk nyicku. Ękännē abi wuöc ya cōk nyic yin men cīn tiēm nē ajuier bennē kōc ya miöc nē wēu kākē, tē cennē keek liep thook ku bī yin ya döm nē theēr pieth.

Yin bī ya miɔɔc nē wēu paan tōŋ de biäk de bëi tō nē Sydney wennē piɔmdīit de Sydney, ku yin cīi bī ya miɔɔc nē bël yiic kedhie. Na yen en tīŋ ke yī bī rōŋ w ennē bël kedhie, ke ka kɔɔr ba ya kɔn loc nē tē bī ya rōŋ kennē yin nē ke yiic kedhie.

Yän kōk peei kedhie tō nē NSW

Nē kaam de pɛsi nīn 18, pɛsi de Dhorou nē ruɔɔn de 2021 yic, ke yin bī ya miɔɔc nē wēu yennēke kuɔny nē kē de riāŋ cīi tuany ē COVID-19 yiēn kɔc, tē cīn thiɔɔŋ nē ye athōɔr de kuɔny kennē:

- Tē rēer yin wennē tē luui yin nē yän kedhie tō paan de New South Wales
- Tē kēn yin wēukuɔɔn adhie nyic keek bæer ya yök tēduɔɔn yin luui thīn nē thæer ke 8 yiic wennē tē èye yin luui nē thæer juēc kōk peei yiic wennē tē èye yin luui kōöl èbēn, nē kē cennē lõŋ tǎäu, lõŋ cennē cǎth kuum nē biäk de Sydney ku piɔmdīit de Sydney
- Yin cī tiēm nē lõŋ kedhie, lõŋ yennēke kɔc yiēn kuɔny kennē ku yin kēn rēer, wennē kennē yin luɔɔl, wennē kennē nem paan de Commonwealth cennē tuany caal ke cī dīt arēetic thīn.

Wēu bennēke yin ya kuɔny ètēnnē aciī bī ya lik agokē ye ajuiæer kennē ya juiëer kɔc.

Yin lēu ba kee wēu kākē ya guikcök tē cennē pɛsi nīn 18, peei de Dhorou de ruɔɔn de 2021 cop.

Wël juēc kōk cī keek gōɔr nē thoŋ de paanduɔn

Yuɔpe nīmira de **131 202** ku jaamē wennē wuɔɔc nē thoŋ de paanduɔn nē kē de wēu ke Centrelink ku jol ya loilooi kōk peei. Kē ba kɔn nyic: Cōt bīn ya cōöt nē nīmira de paanduɔn ke yī cɔl nīmīraai ke “13” tēduɔɔn rēer yin thīn nē Australia aabī wēu cī keek thōŋŋ nhīim ya cam nē telepundu yic. Cām bīi kee wēu ya cam nē telepundu yic, abī ya wuɔɔc amǎath kennē wēu yennē kɔc thii rēer baai ye nīmīraai kākē yuɔpiic ku ka lēu bī ya wuɔɔc èyadēŋ kennē akutnhīim ye jam de telepuun mac (telephone service providers). Yuɔpē nīmira de ‘1800’ nē telepuun de paanduɔnic ke cīn wēu bī keek ya cam. Cōt bennē kɔc ya cōöt nē telepuun ke baai èbēn (public phones) ku jol ya telepuun ye keek muk nē kɔc cīn (mobile phones) aabenēke thæerken ya thōŋŋ ku kaa bī ya cam nē wēu cī keek juak nhīim.

Abī ya lõŋduɔɔn cī tǎäu nē yī yeth ago ya yekēnnē ya tak tē kɔɔr bīn thiɔɔŋ nē athōɔr bennē yin ya miɔɔc nē wēu ku jol ya kueer bīn ye athōɔr kennē ya thiǎŋ thīn, ku ba ye athōɔr ya gōɔr ke ca thōŋŋ ke tēn tōnnē piīrdu thīn.



Information about the COVID-19 Disaster Payment for New South Wales

If you've been in a COVID-19 hotspot or are subject to a period of restricted movement you may be able to get the COVID-19 Disaster Payment if all of these apply:

- you live, work in or visited* a Commonwealth declared COVID-19 hotspot subject to a state or territory restricted movement order
- you had paid employment and because you were in the COVID-19 hotspot or are subject to restricted movement, you can't attend work on or after day 8 the lockdown
- you've lost income on or after day 8 the lockdown and don't have any appropriate paid leave entitlements
- you aren't getting an income support payment, Pandemic Leave Disaster Payment, or a state based pandemic payment
- you meet the liquid assets rule for your location.

*If you visited parts of Sydney or Greater Sydney during the relevant period and were subject to a second public health order that results in your restricted movement, you may also be eligible.

Parts of Sydney

Day 8 of the lockdown for parts of Sydney is 1 July 2021. You can claim up to 5 payments of COVID-19 Disaster Payment for the period Thursday 1 to Friday 30 July 2021.

You can apply for a payment from:

- 1 July 2021 for the period 1 to 7 July 2021
- 8 July 2021 for the period 8 to 14 July 2021
- 15 July 2021 for the period 15 to 21 July 2021
- 22 July 2021 for the period 22 to 28 July 2021
- 29 July 2021 for the period 29 July to 30 July 2021.

This payment is for eligible people who live, work in or visited one of the following Local Government Areas (LGAs):

- Bayside
- City of Sydney
- Canada Bay
- Inner West
- Randwick
- Waverley
- Woollahra.

Greater Sydney

Day 8 of the lockdown for Greater Sydney is 4 July 2021. You can claim up to 4 payments of COVID-19 Disaster Payment for the period Sunday 4 to Friday 30 July 2021.

You can apply for a payment from:

- 4 July 2021 for the period 4 to 10 July 2021
- 11 July 2021 for the period 11 to 17 July 2021
- 18 July 2021 for the period 18 to 24 July 2021
- 25 July 2021 for the period 25 to 30 July 2021.

This payment is for eligible people who live, work in or visited Greater Sydney, the Blue Mountains, the Central Coast, Shellharbour or Wollongong.

You'll need to submit separate claims for each of the first 3 periods of lockdown or restricted movement for parts of Sydney and Greater Sydney.

When you claim for the third period onwards, we'll ask you if we can make automatic payments for future periods. If you agree to this, you'll get a payment each time a new period becomes available without making a claim.

If you have a change in circumstances, you'll need to let us know. This is so we know you remain eligible and pay you the right amount.

You can claim a payment for either parts of Sydney or Greater Sydney, not both. If you think you're eligible for both, you need to decide which is best for you.

All other areas of NSW

For the period starting 18 July 2021, you'll be eligible for COVID-19 Disaster Payment if all of these apply:

- you live or work in any area of New South Wales
- you were unable to earn your usual income of 8 hours or more or a full day's work because of the restricted movement order in parts of Sydney and Greater Sydney
- you meet the general eligibility rules but don't meet the live in, work in or visited a Commonwealth-declared hotspot rule.

There are no liquid assets rules for this event.

You can claim for this period from 18 July 2021.

More information in your language
